THE LUTHERAN REFORMATION

June 3.Board your overnight flight. Your vacation begins the next day.

Dav 1 – June 4 (Sun) – Arrive in Frankfurt, Germany – Mainz Welcome to Germany! Arrive at the airport and meet your Cosmos Tour Director. Enjoy an orientation tour of Frankfurt, the most important German gateway and banking city. Take a journey through time and history as you admire the "Romer," the historic center of town, and theold patrician houses that Frankfurt is famous for. Continue to Mainz for the evening. Upon arrival at the hotel, celebrate the beginning of your trip with a welcome dinner.(Dinner)

Day 2 - June 5 (Mon) - Mainz. Excursion to Worms, Speyer, and Heidelbera

In Worms, where the Imperial Council passed judgement on Luther in 1521, take a guick trip to admire the famed REFORMATION MONUMENT. Walk around the town center, as time allows. Stop in Spever for lunch on your own and visit the CATHEDRAL, a UNESCO World Heritage site. Next, to Heidelberg for a pleasant walk through the OLD TOWN to the famous Martplatz (market square), from whereyou can take pictures of the famous red-walled ruins of Heidelberg Castle. Then, enjoy a beer at the famous Kulturbrauerei Heidelbergefore returning to Mainz. The Keller beer is a personal Globus employee recommendation!(Breakfast)

Day 3 – June 6 (Tues) – Mainz – The Rhine Valley – Marburg – Erfurt Start the day with a scenic RHINE CRUISE past castle-crested cliffs, terraced vineyards, and trim, half-timbered towns in the morning. Drive to Marburg in the afternoon and stop to see the Marburg Castle. It was the location of the Marburg Colloguy in 1529, a particularly important debate between Martin Luther and Zwingli about the theology of the Lord's Supper. Continue to Erfurt, where the fine gothic and renaissance buildings evoke memories of the days of Dominican Master Eckhart and Martin Luther, who spent his student days herebefore embarking on his journey to Wittenberg. Enjoy a group dinner tonight (Breakfast, Dinner)

Day 4 – June 7 (Wed) – Erfurt, Excursion to Mansfield, Eisleben, and Stotternheim

Start the day with a visit to the AUGUSTINIAN MONASTERY, where Luther lived as a monk, and the MERCHANT'S BRIDGE. Journey to Mansfield, city of Martin Luther's childhood and see his parent's home. Then, in Eisleben visit LUTHER'S BIRTHPLACE MUSEUM, LUTHER'S DEATH HOUSE MUSEUM, ST. ANDREW'S CHURCH, and ST. PETER & PAUL CHURCH. During the return to Erfurt, stop in Stotternheim to see the LUTHER STONE, a memorial of the lightning stroke legend that led Luther to become a monk.(Breakfast, Dinner)

Day 5 – June 8 (Thurs) – Erfurt. Excursion to Schmalkalden, Möhra, Eisenach, and Wechmar

Start your day with an excursion to Schmalkalden, famous for the "Schmalkaldic League" and see St. George's Church. Drive through Möhra on the way to Eisenach and see the hometown of Hans Luther. Martin Luther's father. In Eisenach enjoy a guided visit toWARTBURG CASTLE, where Luther translated the New Testament. Also visit LUTHER HOUSE, ST. GEORGE'S CHURCH, and see the Luther and Bach Memorials, Nikolai Church and Gate, through which Luther passed whenever he entered or left Eisenach. On the returnto Erfurt, take a short stop in Wechmar, the family village of Bach. See the Bach family home. (Breakfast)

Day 6 – June 9 (Fri) – Erfurt – Coburg – Leipzig

When the Lutheran princes were presenting the Augsburg Confession in 1530, Luther was sheltered in Coburg, praying, writing letters, and waiting to hear the result of the Diet. We'll visit the VESTECOBURG, one of Germany's largest castles, where Luther lived for sixmonths. We travel to Leipzig to finish our day with a WALKING TOUR. Visit the THOMASKIRCHE, where J.S. Bach worked. It is thehome of the St. Thomas Boys Choir and a place of musical creativity. Also visit the market square that today is a site of celebrations and festivals, but once was the scene of executions and political demonstrations. Enjoy dinner in a local restaurant, followed by some time to explore at leisure. (Breakfast, Dinner)





Day 7 – June 10 (Sat) – Leipzig. Excursion to Wittenberg

We leave Leipzig early for a full day in Wittenberg, Martin Luther's home for 30-plus years and the birthplace of the Reformation. Upon arrival, visit ST. MARY'S CHURCH, a twin-towered gothic church where Luther preached the Reformation, got married (1525), and baptized his six children. Enjoy a guided walking tour and see Luther House, where Martin Luther and his family lived. See the door of the Castle Church where Luther posted his 95 Theses against the sale of indulgences - and launched the Reformation in 1517. A special visit has been included to the renaissance-style MELANCHTHON HOUSE, built in 1536 and today a UNESCO World Heritage Site. It belonged to Philipp Melanchthon, Luther's closest friend and most successful co-worker. Finally, visit the OLD LATIN SCHOOL which is now the Wittenberg Project, an outreach and educational effort of the LCMS. Enjoy dinner and conversation in a local restaurant, and then an evening return to our hotel in Leipzig(Breakfast, Dinner)

Day 8 - June 11 (Sun) - Leipzig - Halle - Jüterbog -Berlin

This morning, visit a local congregation for CHURCH SERVICE. After lunch on your own we make our way to Berlin via Halle and Jüterbog. In Halle we walk around the plaza of the Market Church. Continue to Jüterbog, a town surrounded by a medieval wall, to see St.Nicholas Church and hear about the Pulpit dispute. The church is known for its three fine aisles and features a preserved coffer of Johann Tetzel. Continue to Berlin and celebrate with a group dinner in a local restaurant(Breakfast, Dinner)

Day 9 – June 12 (Mon) – Berlin

Sightseeing with a Local Guide in the once-divided metropolis includes the elegant Ku'damm, the restored Reichstag, CharlottenburgCastle, a picture stop at monumental Brandenburg Gate, the Holocaust Memorial, and the 21-foot Victory Column in the vast TiergartenPark. Visit the KAISER WILHELM MEMORIAL CHURCH with its bomb-damaged tower, drive along Unter den Linden Boulevard, and pass the State Opera House and Checkpoint Charlie. The remainder of the day is at leisure. Breakfast)

Day 10 - June 13 (Tues) - Berlin - Dresden - Prague, **Czech Republic**

Travel to Dresden, former capital of Saxony. Badly damaged by Allied bombing in February 1945, the city has since been restored to its baroque splendor. During your guided walking tour, visit the Zwinger Palace COURTYARD to admire its impressive architecture; the magnificent baroque Semper Opera, originally built in 1841, once destroyed by fire, then destroyed by bombing, and finally restored in 1985; and the newly rebuilt Frauenkirche. Continue to Prague, capital of the Czech Republic. An optional evening to explore Prague bynight is available.(Breakfast)

Day 11 – June 14 (Wed) – Prague

Morning sightseeing with a Local Guide features a visit to the 1,000-year-old HRADANY CASTLE GROUNDS, St. Vitus Cathedral, theOld Town, the Jewish ghetto, and the ASTRONOMICAL CLOCK, once the envy of all Europe. A unique and exclusive visit has been included to the magnificent LIBRARY OF STRAHOV MONASTERY. This evening, a special farewell dinner with wine awaits you at one of Prague's fine restaurants(Breakfast, Dinner)

Day 12 – June 15 (Thurs) – Depart Prague, Czech Republic

Your tour ends today with breakfast, followed by a group transfer to the airport for your home bound flight(Breakfast)
